



## Blackbird Leys Redevelopment Autumn 2024 Community Newsletter

## Welcome to the latest Blackbird Leys community update.

Work is continuing to deliver 294 new affordable homes, retail areas, community facilities, new green spaces and improved roads and cycle routes to Blackbird Leys, in partnership with Oxford City Council and our contractor, The Hill Group.

Since the last newsletter, we've made plenty of progress at the District Centre and Knights Road. This update gives more information on construction that has taken place since our last update, and details about what to expect next.



## **Construction update**

## Over recent months, building work by Hill has included:

#### Road work

At the District Centre, there are some service diversions taking place including to gas, electricity, water and telecommunications to support work on roads and the construction of Block A (near Windrush Tower).

This includes localised traffic restrictions such as two- and three-way controlled traffic lights. Hill is working to reduce disruption as much as possible.

We are also finalising an agreement with Oxfordshire County Council which will allow us to progress with highways works. After this, we will hold a drop-in event to provide more information on how these works will be carried out.

#### **Block A update**

We are taking additional steps to improve building safety in line with the Government's recent Building Safety Act.

We are currently waiting for approval from the Building Safety Regulator before construction work can begin at Block A (near Windrush Tower).

We expect to receive approval from the regulator by the end of November. Construction should then begin in early 2025, with work completing at the end of 2026. These timings will be confirmed once we receive approval.

## Wildlife and ecology

Supporting and protecting wildlife is an important part of the redevelopment plans.

We are improving green networks and providing new habitats for animals. To support preparation for tree work, we installed 37 bird boxes and 37 tree-mounted bat boxes.

Our contractor, Hill, is also taking careful steps when operating around wildlife. This includes changing the street lights and keeping artificial lighting to a minimum to reduce disturbance to wildlife.

Fencing has been placed around the woodland area at Knights Road and construction sites have been designed with ramps for wildlife to move around safely.

## **Blackbird Leys Community Centre**

Since last summer, we have worked with the local community to understand your views and aspirations for the new Blackbird Leys Community Centre and the public space surrounding it.

We have held several events for the community to share their views on the designs as they have progressed, and these have been reflected in latest plans.

The design team is now finalising a detailed planning application, which will be submitted very soon. Once

this is submitted, we will provide information on how to access and comment on the application on Oxford City Council's planning portal.

We will be holding a final exhibition event on Tuesday 15 October at Holy Family Church on Cuddesdon Way, from 2:30 – 6pm to present the final designs to the community.





## Working with the Blackbird Leys Community

Are you interested in working on the Blackbird Leys redevelopment project or learning skills in construction?

Our programme includes opportunities for upskilling, training and employment. In our last newsletter, we outlined some of our commitments to the community.

In this newsletter, we've included further information about what we've been doing, and some of the ways for the community to get involved.

- Career fairs: We hosted a stand at the careers fair at Kassam Stadium, which was attended by 31 schools and colleges and 2,800 students.
- Local workforce: Our bricklaying team has taken on apprentices from the City of Oxford College, Blackbird Leys campus. There are still employment opportunities for Blackbird Leys and Oxfordshire residents at both sites. Contact the team at Hill for more information.
- **Litter picking:** Hill has also been litter picking around the Knights Road site, including in Spindleberry Park, Spindleberry Close and the footpath to Kassam stadium. The team filled 12 bin liners during their most recent litter pick in September (pictures below).
