

# Blackbird Leys Redevelopment December 2024 Community Newsletter

#### Welcome to the latest Blackbird Leys community update

Work is continuing to deliver 294 new affordable homes, shops, community facilities, new green spaces and improved roads and cycle routes to Blackbird Leys, in partnership with Oxford City Council and our contractor, The Hill Group.

Since the last newsletter, we have submitted a planning application to Oxford City Council for the new Blackbird Leys Community Centre.

This update gives more information about the community centre plans, what construction has taken place, and what to expect next.

## **Construction update**

We have made a lot of progress at the District Centre and on Knights Road since work started a year ago.

## A lot more is expected for the coming months. Some of this activity includes:

#### Road work

Road work at the District Centre started in November following an agreement with Oxfordshire County Council. In the first phase we have been creating new foot and cycle paths.

Work will continue over the next couple of months on the central island between the shops and the Church of the Holy Family. Construction of the new cycle path along Blackbird Leys Road will also continue.

From February 2025, work will take place at the junction of Blackbird Leys Road and Cuddesdon Way. This will involve a temporary road closure, and we will need to install temporary lights. We will make sure that all updates on progress are available on the Blackbird Leys website (blackbirdleys.co.uk).



### **Block A update**

In our last newsletter, we updated you on our application to the new Building Safety Regulator, which needs to provide approval before we can start building Block A (opposite the District Centre shops).

The Regulator has asked for some more detailed information which our contractor, Hill, will be providing. This request for additional detail will delay us starting construction.

We are now looking to start work on this block in late spring 2025. We will keep you updated on progress, and we are committed to delivering these homes and new shops. The existing shops will remain in their current location until the new shops are ready to be occupied.



## **Blackbird Leys Community Centre**

In October, we finalised plans for the new Blackbird Leys Community Centre, which we presented to the community at our final exhibition event at Church of the Holy Family Hall.

We have now submitted a detailed planning application to Oxford City Council.

Our vision for the new community centre will:

- Be a hub for social sustainability, community aspiration, and civic pride
- Improve access to community activities, outreach services, socialising, learning and self-improvement
- Be extremely environmentally efficient and sustainable

Since summer 2023, we have worked with the community to shape the final designs. We held more than 40 public events over 12 months, engaging over 1,000 people – or 1 in 12 Leys residents.

Your feedback has helped to shape our plans, which feature:

- A range of community hall sizes, a shared hub, a community kitchen, bookable spaces, lettable offices, and a community garden
- Plenty of open space, landscaped public squares, a central lawn, and new tree planting
- Play areas for children of all ages
- Links to the church and Blackbird Leys Adventure Playground
- A sustainable approach the community centre will be fossil fuel free, feature solar panels and Passive House design principles, and is targeting BREEAM "Excellent" standards.





We expect Oxford City Council's planning committee to consider this application in early 2025.

## Ben Gullett - trainee site manager at Knights Road

I learned about the Hill Apprenticeship Scheme at an apprenticeship fair and chose it over a university place, as I believed having 5 years of paid work experience was invaluable. The first day going to site was daunting, however the site team were very welcoming and helped me to settle in quickly.

What my day looks like can vary massively. I usually start with a perimeter check before completing any inductions that need to take place. I then head onto site for a couple of hours to keep on top of health and safety, monitor deliveries and storage spaces, and answer any questions from on-site workers. After, I head back to the site cabin to complete any office work I need to, for instance filing permits, making signs, completing material orders, or getting tanks refuelled and skips exchanged.

I really enjoy that I'm constantly learning new things in a hands-on way.

My favourite thing about Blackbird Leys is the people working here. Everyone has been very welcoming and has taught me a lot about what happens on site, from site managers to workers across the many different trades.
